

Course Offerings:

Teacher Academy I

• 2 semesters; 2 units

This course is designed for any student who is interested in the field of education as a career. Students are allowed to observe in at least three classrooms throughout the year. They are exposed to both the historical aspect of education and the current events affecting education. Students observe one day per week and are in the classroom the remaining days. Students are expected to take a standardized test at the close of the course.

Teacher Academy II

• 2 semesters; 2 units

This course is designed for all year two Teacher Academy students. Students will again observe at least three classrooms throughout the year, two days per week. Teacher Academy II students are required to work directly with students and teach a mini-lesson and complete a PBA.

Business Fundamentals

• 2 semesters, 2 units

Business Fundamentals is designed as a program for students who wish to pursue a career in the business field. However, it offers something for all students. Students who take Business Fundamentals will learn life skills including how to find and get a job, income and taxes, budgeting, how to use credit, buying a car, buying a house, investing for the future and planning for retirement. Skills learned in this class will be used in everyday life, no matter what career a student pursues.

Marketing

• 2 semesters; 2 units

• Prerequisite: Business Fundamentals

Marketing is designed as a continued program from Business Fundamentals for students who wish to pursue a career in the business/marketing field.

Advanced Manufacturing

• All Year; 2 Units

This course is designed to introduce students to the world of Advanced Manufacturing and establish a foundation for future employment in manufacturing directly out of high school or after college. Students will explore basic manufacturing processes and principles while also gaining hands-on training with pneumatics, electricity, and robotics. Students will receive first-hand experience in learning how to safely operate and use power and hand tools and equipment used in industry to manufacture goods. Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to receive the National Center for Construction Educational Research (NCCER) international certification, as well as dual credit opportunities.

Furniture Manufacturing

• All Year; 2 Units

This course is designed to introduce the student to the world of manufacturing and establish a foundation for manufacturing knowledge in the furniture industry. Students will explore basic manufacturing, materials, tools, techniques, and processes. Students will have first-hand experience in learning how to safely operate equipment to produce products under the instruction and guidance of knowledgeable instructors. Upon completion of the program, students will have the knowledge and experience to obtain a quality job in the furniture industry if they so choose.
