The five smooth stones represent the story of David and Goliath and how David conquered the giant with one smooth stone. Although David took five smooth stones, it only took one to accomplish his mission. The goal of this scholarship is to help young African Americans to conquer their giants in life with the hope of helping them start their road to success.

- **Stone 1 – Dream Big (start your impossible)**
- **Stone 2 – Risk Taker (take chances and build on them)**
- **Stone 3 – Trust (your skills and abilities to achieve your goals)**
- **Stone 4 – Integrity (it will follow you forever)**
- **Stone 5 – Attitude (can do and will do)**

Criteria for the Five Smooth Stones Scholarship is as follows:

1. Must be an African American high school senior
2. Rank in the upper one-half of graduating senior class – Please provide a letter from counselor on school letterhead with GPA and Class Rank or a copy of your transcript
3. Attend college or university in Mississippi
4. Provide 2 recommendation letters from teachers/counselor.
5. Write an essay on “How will I use my 5 smooth stones?” (500 words or video)
6. Write a short essay on “Why a college education is important to me” and “How I will give back during my college career”.
